St. Johns Community

St. Johns is located in the middle of the lower peninsula of Michigan about 20 miles north of Lansing, our state capital. St. Johns is a rural town with a strong manufacturing base and a wide variety of medium to small businesses. The community has one high school, one middle school and four elementary schools.

St. Johns High School is a public, 4-year, comprehensive high school which is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools. The school has a long history of academic and co-curricular excellence.

Our school year consists of three 12-week trimesters. A grade report is issued at the end of each 12 weeks. St. Johns High School uses a block schedule with 5 classes plus a 40 minute seminar period each day.
